

Financial Assistance Fact Sheet for Victims of Bradley Earl Reger of Susanville, California

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- California resident
- Non-resident victimized in California

BENEFITS AVAILABLE:

- Mental health including treatment outside of California if the provider is licensed in the same state in which the victim lives.
- Medical care
- Relocation
- Home security

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Sacramento Division and Homeland Security Investigations are seeking to identify potential victims of Bradley Earl Reger of Susanville. Individuals victimized by Reger who previously or currently reside in other states, but were victimized in California, can qualify for financial assistance.

The California Victim Compensation Board (CalVCB) encourages individuals victimized by Reger in California to file an application. Up to \$70,000 in financial assistance may be available for victims of sexual assault, even if they live outside of California and it has been years since the abuse occurred.

Compensation is a lifelong benefit. Even if victims of crime do not need help right now, they may need it later, and CalVCB will be here to assist them by paying for crime related expenses.

Family members who have expenses or needs may also qualify for benefits.
